Services include HIV, STI/STD testing, counseling, and supportive primary care services consistent with clinical guidelines for PrEP. PrEP medication will be provided to uninsured or underinsured individuals through the manufacturer patient assistance programs (PAP) (listed below). Providers that are enrolled in the New York State Medicaid Program are eligible to enroll in PrEP-AP.
