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Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment Program (DSRIP) PSA: PART I

In 2014, Governor Cuomo announced healthcare reforms to change the way Medicaid works in New York State. Eight billion dollars in federal savings from Medicaid reforms were reinvested to create the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment Program called DSRIP, a key step toward value based payment reform. DSRIP reimburses teams of Medicaid providers and community based organizations called Performing Providers Systems for PPS's. The reimbursements are based on goals aimed at improving quality patient care and reducing avoidable hospital use by 25 percent. Through system transformation, clinical improvement, and prevention, New York State is making it easier for Medicaid patients to take better care of themselves. All Medicaid providers in New York State can support DISRIP by keeping patients healthy, following prevention guidelines, screening for mental health and substance use, and providing high quality care. Primary care physicians like Dr. Johnson have partnered with social workers and nurses and joined together under the local PBS to reach these goals. Together. This will help New Yorkers achieve better care and better health at lower costs.
